***Let the World See* Exhibit Opens at Cincinnati's National Underground Railroad Freedom Center on Jan. 10th**

Following its run at the Northwest African American Museum in Seattle, the award-winning exhibit, *Emmett Till & Mamie Till-Mobley: Let the World See*, will be coming to the [National Underground Railroad Freedom Center](#) in Cincinnati. The exhibit opens on January 10th and concludes on April 6th. The exhibit is free with admission to the museum.

Developed in partnership with The Children's Museum of Indianapolis, the Emmett Till and Mamie Till-Mobley Institute, and the Emmett Till Interpretive Center, the exhibit tells the stories of Emmett's life prior to his fateful Mississippi trip, Mamie's courage in the face of tragedy, and the work to preserve their legacies despite the challenges. It was designed with families in mind and comes with a recommended age of 10 and up. Last year the American Association for State and Local History recognized the exhibit with a [History in Progress Award](#).

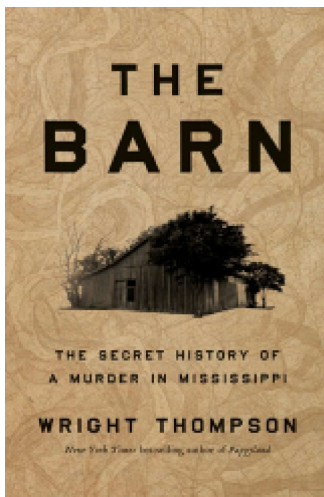
